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MENTORS ROLES:

The Mentor is an essential member of the CCLP. Leading their team of student participants (3-4 in each group)



FACILITATOR:

Using our CCLP guidelines and in consultation with the Course Director (Peter Merrill, Philips Andover), Mentors are responsible for facilitating online courses, tests and activities that contribute to the leadership development experiences of students. While the majority of the CCLP course has already been created, Mentors are encouraged to use their own unique skills, experience and passions to modify these sessions based on the needs of their particular group. Your students will be in changing teams of students from around the world, with each team having students from 3-4 different counties. There will also be an in person capstone course in summer 2019.

DEVELOPMENTAL GUIDE:

As a mentor you are expected to assist with the process of discovering the self and fostering a nurturing environment where student participants can seek your advice. Having an in-depth knowledge of the UN Developmental goals and the problems that face the current generation are a plus and will bring an added dynamic to this blended online learning course. Additionally, working with WLSA means working with colleagues with shared and complementary knowledge, interests and an integrated knowledge of global leadership, and in the teaching of these goals. In the process of your participation, you can expect also to develop improved self-knowledge.

For mentors, the CCLP occurs over a 12-month blended-learning program in three phases:

- **Phase Zero**- 1 Week – Mentor training
- **Phase One**- 9 Months- Teams of 3-4 students and one adult mentor based primarily online
 - Work will be done both individually and with shifting multinational teams
 - Some in-person/skype work required
 - Broken down into three 8-week terms
 - 2-3 hours/week
 - Learning channels include: online lectures, readings, group discussions, journaling, home-school and networked mentor support, local team projects, online/multinational team projects
- **Phase Two**- 2 Weeks -Capstone team project in July 2019 location TBD

QUALIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF MENTORS:

- Supervise and support the leadership development needs of 3-4 students at your institution both online and for a capstone course, location TBD
- Be a content-area resource for interdisciplinary work done by programme participants
- Attend a mentor training before the course begins
- Support the Course Administration team in Amsterdam in the overall operation of the course
- Travel and facilitate the capstone course in Summer 2019
- Be willing to do a bit of work over holidays if your institutions holidays don't line up precisely with those of the programme
- Be a member in good standing with your current academic institution



Due to the length and dedication of this course, Mentors are offered travel reimbursement for the initial training (if in-person training is required) in July 2018 and the capstone project in Summer 2019. Lodging is also provided for all course staff. Workload compensation during the academic-year portion of the programme is to be worked out with home institutions.
